Read collection overview

Living in Keswick, England, at the start of the second world war, parents Jack D. and Audrey S. Monro were separated from their children, Elspeth and Robin, for nearly six years. Throughout this time they each wrote letters fairly consistently, detailing the war itself and personal news. Elspeth and Robin traveled from England to the United States in the summer of 1940, aged 8 and 10, as fears of bombings and violence from Germany dominated the news in Europe. They moved in with the family's close friends to a house in Baltimore, Maryland. By moving to the United States, they left behind a whole life in England: a majority of their family, their friends, and a culture with which they were familiar with.

The collection details civilian life via letters written in England during the second world war from the perspective of parents separated from their children. Spanning from 1938 through 1946, they document the general instability that was faced during this time, including personal family news, everyday life during a time of war, issues regarding divorce, and issues relating of the separation with their children.

Background on Monro, Jack D.; Monro, Audrey

Living in Keswick, England, at the start of the second world war, parents Jack D. and Audrey S. Monro were separated from their children, Elspeth and Robin, for nearly six years. Throughout this time they each wrote letters fairly consistently, detailing the war itself and personal news.

Elspeth and Robin traveled from England to the United States in the summer of 1940, aged 8 and 10, as fears of bombings and violence from Germany dominated the news in Europe. They moved in with the family's close friends Georgia and Hamilton Davis, along with their own four children, in a house in Baltimore, Maryland. By moving to the United States, they left behind a whole life in England: a majority of their family, their friends, and a culture with which they were familiar with.

Both Jack and Audrey worked as teachers when the war began, careers that shifted as the economy became more and more unstable in England. Life was in constant turmoil, with shortages, fears of bombings, and

overall instability affecting those who remained in England. Even beyond the impacts of war, the couple experienced their own difficulties as well, separating in 1939, just before the children moved to Baltimore, and divorcing in 1942.

Travel to the United States became increasingly hard to obtain, with more requirements and reasons for travel being needed. Eventually, Audrey was able to acquire a passage to the United States to visit with her children, sending her final letter from the collection on April 13, 1946, just before her voyage.

Scope of collection

Written between 1938 and 1946 at the height of the second World War, the collection offers a glimpse into civilian life in England during this time. Consisting entirely of correspondence, a majority of the letters are sent from Audrey and Jack, some to their two children, Elspeth and Robin Monro, and others to their friends in Baltimore, Georgia and Hamilton Davis. Other letters come from friends and family back in England to Elspeth and Robin. Some newspaper clippings, cigarette cards, drawings, and other items are enclosed and referenced to in the letters.

The letters hold information about the war itself and its effect on England, including bombings, ship sinkings, shortages, and evacuations that occurred. They also document personal family news, everyday life during a time of war, issues regarding divorce, and issues relating to the separation with their children. Different accounts are offered between what is addressed to Elspeth and Robin and that for Georgia and Hamilton, bringing different perspectives into the situation. Jack's letters are complex and deal with topics like religion and philosophy, as well as updates on his career and remarriage. Audrey's letters are more optimistic, at least in the beginning and towards the children, though her true feelings are conveyed more in letters to Georgia. Both Audrey and Jack sought advice from Georgia and Hamilton on how to tell children about their divorce and where they should stay following the conclusion of the war. At times, letters from Audrey and Jack will reference one another, emphasizing the tenuous nature of their relationship as they each attempt to guide their children in ways that often contradict.

Series descriptions

<u>Series 1. Audrey S. Monro Correspondence</u> 1938 Jul. 27-1946 Feb. 27 1 box

Series 1 contains Audrey's letters, primarily directed towards her two children, Elspeth and Robin, and to their caretaker, Georgia Davis. Her letters are generally positive, conveying a hopefulness that the mother will soon be reunited with her children should an Atlantic passage become possible. They bring glimpses of everyday life during this time period, outlining times when the mail system was facing difficulties, simplified versions of war-based events, and descriptions of a single woman living in England between 1938 and 1946. Letters directed towards those other than her children are somewhat bleaker and deal with more personal themes.

<u>Series 2. Jack D. Monro Correspondence</u> 1940 Aug. 14-1946 Apr. 23 .5 box

Series 2 contains Jack's letters, primarily directed towards his two children, Elspeth and Robin, and to their caretaker, Georgia Davis. His letters are more spiritual and apprehensive, dealing with themes of religion and the war. Ranging from 1940 through 1945, they detail everyday life during this time period for a man involved in both education and military affairs, including travel to foreign countries also tied into England's involvement in the war.

Series 3. Other Correspondents 1940 Oct. 7-1945 Jun. 18 .5 box

Series 3 contains letters written by those other than Audrey and Jack, including both extended family members and friends of Elspeth and Robin. These letters focus more on personal news than war-based news, all sent between 1940 and 1945.
