Background on Deborah Johnson-Simon

Dr. Deborah Johnson-Simon, PhD, is a museum anthropologist dedicated to advancing social justice and fostering community engagement through cultural heritage projects. She focuses on attracting and maintaining African American audiences and works extensively on museum outreach and development. Dr. Johnson-Simon is the co-editor of The Second Generation of African American Pioneers in Anthropology, a work that highlights significant contributions in the field. She is the founder and CEO of the African Diaspora Museology Institute (ADMI), formerly known as the Center for the Study of African and African Diaspora Museums and Communities (CFSAADMC). The institute is committed to conducting and distributing research on the history and culture of African and African Diaspora museums and communities, furthering the understanding of their impact and significance. Dr. Johnson-Simon's research interests center on these communities' cultural and historical narratives, emphasizing their role in museum studies and broader cultural heritage. Dr. Johnson-Simon received her BA from Rollins College in 1997 and her MA from Arizona State University with a certification in Museum Studies. She earned her PhD in 2007 from the University of Florida in 2007. The Deborah Johnson-Simon Papers document Dr. Johnson-Simon's research, travels, and professional engagements. The collection includes photographs from her research in Arizona, culminating in Culture Keepers Arizona, as well as ephemera from her time at Rollins College in Florida and her research and teaching at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville, Florida. It also highlights her extensive work with and on Rev. Dr. C.T. Vivian and the C.T. Vivian Leadership Institute. Additionally, the collection contains an extensive collection of cards from individuals she met at conferences, during research, and while traveling. Notably, it includes her work with industrial designer Charles "Chuck" Harrison, who revolutionized the View-Master, along with a View-Master and more than 80 accompanying slides.

Scope of collection

The Deborah Johnson-Simon Collection exemplifies her work as an African and African American museum consultant, including collaborations with organizations like the C.T. Vivian Leadership Institute. The collection highlights her contributions as an anthropologist, featuring research notes, correspondence, ephemera, photographs, and materials from projects such as Cultural Keepers. It underscores Dr. Johnson-Simon's dedication to preserving and disseminating African and African American cultural heritage through her research on Black pioneers, activists, and social justice leaders such as C.T. and Octavia Vivian and Charles "Chuck" Harrison. The collection also documents her educational background, with ephemera relating to her college experiences, her career in higher education, and her professional engagements, including presentations and conferences. It reflects her time living and working in Arizona, Florida, and Georgia and insights into her national and international research trips and personal travels. The Deborah Johnson-Simon Collection comprises a variety of materials—visual media, photographs, correspondence, ephemera, administrative records, and artifacts—and provides a comprehensive view of her impactful career, professional engagements, and dedication to cultural preservation.

Series descriptions

Series 1. Culture Keepers 1993-2009 3 boxes

This series documents Dr. Johnson-Simon's Culture Keepers project, a major initiative highlighting African American cultural preservation. The materials consist of photographs, correspondence, cards, interviews, and related ephemera from over 30 African American individuals and cultural leaders, as well as institutions across Arizona. This series offers insight into the cultural landscapes and oral histories of Black communities and showcases Dr. Johnson-Simon's methodological approach to fieldwork, cultural outreach, and community documentation.

Series 2. Charles 'Chuck' Harrison 1993-2009 3 boxes

This series focuses on Dr. Johnson-Simon's professional relationship and research on industrial designer Charles "Chuck" Harrison. It includes correspondence, cards, ephemera, resumes, photographs, a View-Master with over 80 slides, and a copy of Harrison's book A Life's Design. The series reflects Harrison's contributions as an African American innovator in design and Dr. Johnson-Simon's efforts to document and highlight underrepresented figures in design history.

Series 3. Subject Files and Correspondence 1959-2015 3 boxes

Comprising a diverse array of materials, this series includes personal correspondence, educational memorabilia, graduation announcements, awards, ephemera, and photographs. It also documents Dr. Johnson-Simon's academic milestones and professional engagements, including her studies at Rollins College, Arizona State University, and the University of Florida, as well as her participation in conferences and cultural organizations. The series paints a comprehensive portrait of her educational background and evolving career in anthropology and museology.

Series 4. Arizona 2000-2009 2 boxes

This series captures Dr. Johnson-Simon's time living and working in Arizona. Materials include photographs, postcards, cards, and memorabilia related to community members, cultural events, festivals, and professional engagements. Highlights include materials from the George Washington Carver Museum, interactions with local artists, and educational initiatives, reflecting her deep community involvement and regional impact.
